Mayor Rhonda Hagan invited all to say the *Pledge Allegiance to the Flag* and then called to order the regular monthly Bloomfield City Council meeting at 6:30 p.m. at the Bloomfield Fire House. Councilmembers present were Tracye Cheek, Donnie Holt, Mark Mays, Walter Pozgay and Tammy Wimpsett. City Attorney Amanda Blincoe and Kentucky Standard Reporter Jennifer Corbett were also present. Councilman Denny Howard was absent.

MINUTES AND FINANCIAL REPORTS: Council members were hand delivered a copy of the May 13th regular meeting minutes whereby the reading was waived. Pozgay made motion, duly seconded by Holt, to approve the meeting minutes. *Motion carried by unanimous decision.* Next, Cheek made a motion, duly seconded by Holt, to approve the financial reports as presented. *Motion carried by unanimous decision.*

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

SALARY REVIEW: Howard made a motion, duly seconded by Holt, to grant a \$1 per hour wage increase for all employees that are not on the "new hire" wage increase schedule. *Motion carried by unanimous decision.*

ORDINANCE 2013-90, FISCAL YEAR 2013-2014 BUDGET: Pozgay read the second reading of the 2013-2014 fiscal year budget ordinance. Mays made a motion, duly seconded by Pozgay, to approve the ordinance. *Motion passed by the following 5-0 roll call vote:* Cheek-yes, Holt-yes, Mays-yes, Pozgay-yes, Wimpsett-yes. See "Exhibit A".

DELINQUENT TAXES FOR 2012: Pozgay made a motion, duly seconded by Wimpsett, for the City Clerk to place liens, on behalf of the city, on real properties, that owe 2012 taxes. *Motion carried by unanimous decision.* See "Exhibit B".

WATER-WASTEWATER ORDINANCE AMENDMENT: Mayor Hagan asked Pozgay if he would meet with Howard, the Public Works Superintendent and Billing Clerk to address specific changes in this ordinance.

NEW BUSINESS

AMENDMENT TO OWNER-ENGINEER AGREEMENT: The Wastewater Improvement Project is scheduled to have approximately \$992,000 in contingencies from the original 2.3 million dollar project financed by Rural Development and Ky Infrastructure Authority targeted for the construction of the force main to Bardstown. Mayor Hagan presented an amendment agreement for Strand Associates to provide engineering services for a new project addressing the City's infiltration and inflow problems throughout the City for an additional fee of \$148,980 based on construction cost of \$750,000 for the design elements listed in the amendment. Pozgay made a motion, duly seconded by Wimpsett, to authorize the Mayor to sign and execute the amendment agreement. *Motion carried by unanimous decision.*

VACATION DAYS: In regard to the 2012-2013 fiscal year occurrence of being without a Public Works Superintendent for part of the year and the Assistant Public Works Superintendent reported for duty to fill the position until he was certified and maintain his day-to-day operation for the City and Water Company this employee could not take vacation leave and has a carry over of 20 days. It was the consensus of the Council to allow this employee to opt for additional pay for 10 vacation days or carry them over along with the 10 days already allowed.

MAYOR REPORT: Mayor Hagan presented a four page "City of Bloomfield Progress" report. She's making it available to all citizens by posting it at City Hall, Library and Post Office. She plans to update these from time to time. She also spoke of a 3'x5' sign board (donated by Tracye Cheek) that she plans to post events and happenings on a periodic basis. She informed the Council of the July 12, 2013 closing date for the \$75,200 sale of the Civic Center. Council consensus was to surplus all the remaining contents and advertise them for sealed bid and schedule the bid opening two weeks later by the close of the business day.

AMENDED RESOLUTION 2013-104, TO RENDER AID: Pozgay read this resolution, drafted by Attorney Blincoe, which declares the intent of the Council that the Bloomfield Police Department be authorized to render aid to other law enforcement agencies outside the city limits should an emergency or necessary situation arise. Pozgay made a motion, duly seconded by Cheek, to adopt the resolution.

Motion carried by unanimous decision.

POLICE CHIEF DOWNS: Chief Downs spoke of the tragic murder of Bardstown Canine Officer Jason Ellis that occurred approximately 2:30 a.m. May 25, 2013 at the entrance ramp to Bloomfield at the Bluegrass Parkway at Exit 34, three miles south of Bloomfield. He has aided all investigation on behalf of the City of Bloomfield in search of the killer/killers. He spoke of the many State Police road blocks in and around Bloomfield and encouraged all to keep authorities informed of any leads. He also said he would check with the Kentucky Highway District 4 to see if Taylorsville Road could have a 35 mph speed limit changed to 25 mph coming down the first block. Consensus was given for him to pursue this.

CONCERNS OF THE COUNCIL

Holt asked if the Council would review the nuisance ordinance to include "noise" as a nuisance.

Mays talked about the Wastewater Improvement Project construction that is soon scheduled to come through his property and others' on Riverside Drive.

Pozgay relayed holes in the flags at the memorial. He spoke of the city considering a "Commerce" web site that would be easier to work with and that would possibly take water bill and tax payments.

Wimpsett talked about the chalk graffiti on the downtown brick buildings and spoke of an American flag that may be painted on the side of a business building.

Cheek made motion, duly seconded by Wimpsett, to adjourn at 7:25 p.m. *Motion carried by unanimous decision.*

ORDINANCE 2013-90

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE CITY OF BLOOMFIELD KENTUCKY ANNUAL BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2013-JUNE 30, 2014

Estimating Revenue and Resources and Appropriating Funds for Operation of City Government

WHEREAS, an annual budget proposal and message has been prepared and delivered to the Bloomfield City Council and

WHEREAS, the Bloomfield City council has reviewed such budget proposal and made the necessary modifications, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF BLOOMFIELD,

SECTION 1: That the annual budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013 and ending June 30, 2014 is hereby adopted as follows:
